The Reuvensdagen is an annual archaeological congress in the Netherlands. It is the only general research congress that brings Dutch archaeologists together from all echelons and specializations. Due to the corona crisis, the congress was held online and reduced to one day, on 19 November 2020, with several sessions.

The Dutch EU_CUL partners participated in one of these sessions, called "Enabling Archeology". The session addresses inclusivity and diversity in archaeology, and how the sector can be made accessible for everyone.

There were four different perspectives on inclusivity and diversity in archaeology that were addressed in this session. The social responsibility of higher education (presented by EU_CUL member Miyuki Kerkhof), public participation in South Africa, modern heritage of the minoritized Maluku people in the Netherlands, and engaging people with disabilities or of socio-economic disadvantaged groups.

It was a fruitful opportunity to introduce not only EU_CUL activities to over 700 online participants, but also introduce some of the case studies that feature in the EU_CUL project. EU_CUL member Kerkhof joined in the panel discussion to talk further on the importance of universities' social responsibility in education and the heritage field.
